How to use this book to register for programs.

Registration – begins Saturday, March 28th, at 9:00 a.m. (until noon) at our offices (Teen Center) for Weymouth Residents only! Non-resident registration begins, April 13th.

- **Photo IDs:** A Weymouth Recreation issued photo ID is <u>required</u> of all program participants. These IDs <u>must</u> be presented at summer program check-in. See details on page 7.
- Weymouth Recreation cannot accept registrations by mail, phone, or fax!

Two easy ways to register!

How to Register Online

Step 1: Create a "Household Account"

- 1. Go to www.weymouth.ma.us/rec
- 2. On the left-hand column there is a list of links. Click on Online Registration
- 3. Scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on the big "Go to Online Registration" Button.
- 4. The MYREC page should now be on your screen Click on the red house in the upper left corner.
- 5. In the middle of the page you will see **Not A Website Member?** It's FREE! <u>Click Here</u> to create your personal username and password. Click on the words <u>Click Here</u>
- 6. Pick a primary contact person for your family (He/She must be over 18 years old)
- 7. Put in the primary contact's last name and home phone number. Click Submit.
- 8. Enter in all the primary contacts information..
- 9. For an emergency contact please enter information for someone not in your household that we can contact in the event that we cannot get in touch with you in an emergency.
- 10. Click Submit
- 11. Review the information that comes up.
- 12. Click on the Add a Household Member button on the right hand side at the bottom of the page..
- 13. Enter in the information of another family member. Click Submit.
- 14. Repeat until you have added all the members of your family.

Step 2: Register for a Program after a Household Account has been established

- 1. Repeat 1 4 listed above; you will then be asked to sign in remember that your user name would be your email address and the password would be what you have set up.
- 2. Under the Weymouth Recreation banner at the top left of the page there is a list of links. Click on *Program Schedule*.
- 3. To select a program you can either:
 - a. Click on *Classes and Activities* for a full list of programs.
 - b. In the search box you can type in the name of the program you are looking to register for. Be as specific as possible or nothing will come up.
- 4. Once you find the desired program follow the link.
- 5. Read the information at the top of the page regarding the program
- 6. There will be two buttons to the right of the program information. Click on the one that says Register Online.
- 7. Select the household member(s) that you are signing up for the program. Click Submit.
- 8. Click Next.
- 9. Please confirm that you have read and agree to the Disclaimer statement by checking the appropriate box.
- 10. To complete your order, click *Place Secure Online Order* and enter the payment information.
- 11. You will receive a confirmation that your order went through at the e-mail address you provided for your household account.

- **In person registration**: between March 28th and April 10th will require a utility bill and picture ID to verify residency. Registration at our office will be, first person <u>ready</u> first served, regardless of payment method. It will be like checking out at the supermarket once you've committed to the schedule. Payment in person may be by cash, check, credit or debit card. Staff will be available to answer program questions. We hope the process will be smoother than last year! After March 28th registration will be available during regular office hours: Monday Fridays 8:30 a.m. 4:30 p.m., Fridays 4:30 6:00 p.m. by appointment.
- Payment: Full payment must accompany all registrations. On-line by credit card (Mastercard, VISA, Discover or American Express). At our office by cash, check, credit or debit card. Please note: All prices listed in this book are the discount price. The price will go up 10% two weeks prior to the start date of the program. This policy has been in effect for several months and really truly helps us plan for and present a better program. Register early and save yourself some money.
 Credit card charge backs: Please do not charge back any fees paid to

Weymouth Recreation. Legitimate concerns (double billed, overpaid or cancelled class...) should be brought to us to work out. Charge backs are a headache for us whether we win the appeal or not - so we will try to win. This is not a way around our no-refund policy!


Friends and Forms: A registration form is needed for each family that is planning to register. If you wish to have children from different families attend together, coordinate your on-line registration or any person can deliver <u>fully</u> completed and signed registration forms with full payment and proof of residency for each family (between 3/28 & 4/13).

Our Recreation Philosophy:

We believe recreation should be fun and educational. We teach basic skills through fun and interactive "play". Our summer staff will approach their role with the goal of presenting an "excellent" experience by enthusiastically engaging and encouraging program participants. Participants will learn fundamental skills, socialization, team concepts and good sportsmanship in each activity. We are proud of our role in developing the leaders of tomorrow through fun!



Important Information

Registration - Resident / Non-resident Policy: Weymouth residents only may register from March 28th (9:00 a.m.) through April 12th - on-line and in person (through April 10th). To register in person during this period, residents must present a utility bill and a picture ID with the home address for each family they are registering. Beginning Monday, April 13th registration will become "open" to everyone. Non-Weymouth residents that register between March 28th and April 12th will be removed. Please respect this policy. The residency / contact information you enter is critical in dealing with any emergencies your child may experience during the programs. It also must match your credit card's information or your card will be rejected as payment.

All prices listed in this book are discount prices and will rise 10% 2 weeks prior to the start of each program. Register early! Office hours March 28th will be 9:00 a.m. – Noon.



No Refunds or Credits: Refunds for all programs will only be issued when we have to cancel the program. Plan before you commit and register carefully!!! To be fair to everyone - No exceptions can be made. Refunds will not be given for a participant removed from a program for disciplinary reasons (see below) or failure to meet program requirements (submit health forms...). Refunds will be by Town of Weymouth check or by crediting the credit card you used. Please allow four weeks for check processing. This policy has been adopted in an effort to keep program prices as low as possible. Any time we spend processing refunds is time we cannot commit to creating or running programs! How to get rid of an unwanted class: 1- check the wait list report we will post online every Friday; 2. sell it to a friend

(the office has to oversee this transaction to ensure roster accuracy) 3. Transfer to another week – a later week requires at least 7 days advance notice (we can not refund or credit any difference in program fees).

Cancellations: We reserve the right to cancel or combine any program(s) with insufficient registrations.



Rainy Day Programs / Weather: Great Esker Park program and all vendor programs will be weather dependent but will continue to offer a corresponding but separate **pre-paid** rainy day option, by week, for those of you that need your child (age 4 or older) watched during all program hours, rain or shine. This rain day option applies only to those programs that run 3 or more hours per day. The cost for the rain option is a flat \$8.00 / week. When the Great Esker Park / vendor program rain option kicks in registered participants will be transported to the Wey-Fun Program at the Wessagusset School to join in the activities of that program. The rainy day option may be purchased at any time!

Safety Notes: The notes section on your registration form is the place to let us know: Medical concerns / Medications – Please let us know in writing if your child has any



medical concerns (allergies, sun sensitivity, seizures...) Please keep your child on necessary medications. Be aware the staff cannot administer any prescribed medications with the exception of epi-pens.



Disciplinary Policy: Any participant that detracts from the enjoyment of another participant or the duties of the staff will be warned, once, and the incident will be reported to the parent that day. The participant will be removed if there is another incident that week. Two removals will result in a ban from all programs for the season. Refunds will not be given for a participant removed from a program for disciplinary reasons.

Photo / video release: Weymouth Recreation reserves the right to have program participants photographed or videotaped for any publicity purposes including cable, newspapers, flyers, brochures, and our web page...Your registration will serve as your release.





Bus / Shuttle Information: Please register for bus transportation for each week including the Wey-Fun / Great Esker Park / Beach shuttles! If your child can not communicate their schedule, please let the bus attendant know where they are going and when. Weymouth Recreation provides bus transportation according to the following schedule for full-day Wey-Fun, Great Esker or combination participants. Please have your child at the appropriate bus stop before the time noted. Please let the office know specifically, through the notes section while registering or in writing, if your child is only riding one way, even for a day, or any other special circumstances. Children will be dropped at the same stop

where they boarded the bus unless we are otherwise instructed, in writing. There will be an attendant on the bus – but no staff at each stop. For the safety of your child - please see your child onto the bus and be there to pick them up when they get off! Note: There is no access to the schools at these bus stops in the event of rain!

T-shirts – will be designated by age range. T-shirts are **required** for the Wey-Fun, Great Esker, Sprouts and Exceptional Program. There are some age overlaps so you will have to decide whether you want your child to be the youngest or oldest in their age-group. If your child does not have a t-shirt when they arrive at their program you will need to buy one for \$7.00. Program shirts are available at our office, or at each program site.

Most programs require an age-appropriate Weymouth Recreation t-shirt. Age (years): 3-4 red; 4–6 gold; 6–8 stonewash green; 8-10 lime green & 10+ light blue The \$7.00 price was not included in the program price to save frequent participants money.





Photo Id's: Will be required of all participants prior to summer program participation. We will need each participant to provide their latest emergency contact information; sit for a picture ID (in 2009, 2011, 2013...) and present a birth certificate or passport as proof of age (only once - if you are currently between 3

and 15 years of age). Please bring your old ID to renew. The ID's make the check-in and check-out procedures for our summer programs safer and more efficient. They also ensure program participants are the appropriate age.

A complete processing schedule will be posted to our web-site and in the March newsletter.

> Restricted pick-up – Please let us know in writing, and note on the program check-in form, if you want to designate who can pick up your child. Every listed person will need to have a photo ID.



Wey-Fun is committed to providing the best possible program with as much participant choice as possible. Wessagusset School and Beach and O'Sullivan Playground will have activities scheduled for each age group plus a "free zone".



Based at the Wessagusset School, this complex boasts numerous fields and play areas that include: baseball/softball diamonds; basketball and street hockey courts, a large arts & crafts/picnic table area with market style umbrellas and the waterfront of Wessagusset Beach. The program will feature activities in arts & crafts, sports, group games, weekly special events and attractions, and water front activities all at your child's option – twice a day! Multiple sports will be featured and scheduled on a daily

basis. In addition we are offering single sport theme weeks. See page 10 for details.

When it rains participants will utilize the Wessagusset School gym and cafeteria on site or they may be transported by bus to Pilgrim Church, Country Club Lanes (bowling), the Weymouth Teen Center, or other "Rain Day" locations. The specific destination will be posted on our message board onsite at the Wessagusset School, on our web page (www.weymouth.ma.us/rec) or you can call the Recreation office at 781-682-6124. If your child goes "off site", they will be returned to the Wessagusset School gym at lunch and at the end of each day.

Age Grouping! 4- 6 age group welcome to attend morning session only! Limited seating of 14 spots – so register early! This age group will spend their time <u>as a</u> <u>group</u> between the 3 Wey-Fun locations. Wey-Fun is all about choice! Participants in the three oldest age groups: 6 – 8 (Rookies), 8 – 10 (Minors) and 10+ (Pros) will choose where they want to go for their morning or afternoon three hour 'fun block". Counselors will gather their age groups together and recite the schedules for those that struggle with reading or for those that need to be sold on where they want to go. If the scheduled activities don't excite you – gather some friends for a game of "OUT", four-square, shuffleboard or chess in one of the three free zones sites!







Fun Block Time Frames

New this year the "lunch bunch" – made up of staff of various programs - has gone away and the Wey-Fun staff will be splitting their lunches in order to cover the group. This will have no effect on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. On Tuesday and Thursday the Fun Blocks will be reduced to 2 ½ hours for both morning and afternoon sessions. This allows the staff that knows your child the best to properly supervise them at all times. Your child will remain on site the same amount of time on Tuesday and Thursday but 11:30 - 1:30 will be supervised free play time with lunch at noon.

At Wey-Fun we'll focus on a different Sport Theme each week of the program for age groups 8+



Our Wey-Fun program will include a single sport FUN-damentals theme option for age groups 8 +. Programs will focus on development of fundamental skills as well as game concepts and scrimmaging. All players will be grouped according to age and/or ability. This will be a focused yet fun environment to work on playing skills both individually and as a team player. The programs listed below will be the theme during the morning Fun Block time period listed; the extent of how long the activity is played will depend upon the group.

SPROUTS 3 – 8 years old



A Weymouth Recreation issued photo ID is required for this program. This requires sitting for a picture ID and birth certificate for anyone between 3 and 8 years old for this program.

The Sprouts Program <u>requires</u> an age-appropriate Weymouth Recreation t-shirt. **Ages:** 3-4 – Red; 4-6 – Gold; 6-8 – Stonewash Green



The Sprouts Program will again take place at WESTON PARK – located behind the Tufts library in Weymouth Landing. This program is for children from three to eight years of age. The three age groups 3-4, 4-6, and 6-8 will have a varied "schedule" from day to day and options as often as possible. The age groups will be split to accommodate particular activities. Participants can choose, and stay with, their "friends" if a group splits.

Why do certain ages overlap? This is so <u>you</u> can decide where your child "fits" best. The 3-4 year old age-group will meet for 1 hour and twenty minutes, from 9:00 a.m. to 10:20 a.m. (Mini's) or 10:40 - 12:00 p.m. (Tot's). We strongly recommend registering your 3-4 year old for only 1 session / week. A 'daily theme' approach will help to develop social interaction, physical coordination, fitness and good "*SPROUTS-manship*".

Our innovative and enthusiastic staff will fill your child's week with activities such as: sports, games, challenges, scooters, scavenger hunts, face painting, sidewalk art, parachutes, nature walks around the park, basketball and soccer and special events. Creativity will be encouraged through arts & crafts and 'hands-on' projects that your child can bring home.

Tenderfoot Program - Ages 3-4 years old

Based out of the George A. Clark Nature Center and using the newly renovated Julia Rd. Playground to explore the "nature of the park" through stories, arts & crafts, and nature exploration – either found or brought to the group. Ratios will be 5:1 and participants must be potty trained.

Esker Rovers Program – Ages 4-6 years old

Participants will "Rove" the park from the George A. Clark Jr. Nature Center to the Back River. These short hikes along with stories, arts and crafts, and plenty of hands on nature discovery will introduce the participants to the basics of how the park works! The new name extensions are designed to break the class size up into more manageable sizes. Please coordinate with friends to make sure you enroll in the same class.

Discoverer Program - Ages 6-8 years old

Participants will "Discover" the fundamental concepts of the "science" of the park as they uncover the web of relationships between the physical elements and the bugs and birds and fish and plants through group walk-abouts and competitions. Longer hikes, stories, nature crafts, games, contest and plenty of hands on nature discovery will bring into focus some of the lesser known mysteries of the park. As with Rovers the new name extensions are designed to break the class size up into more manageable sizes. Please coordinate with friends to make sure you enroll in the same class.

Explorer Program (8-10 years old) and Adventurer Programs (10+ years old)

- Biking (8-10, 10+) Program focus is on Wampatuck State Park. May travel to other locations. We try to minimize road travel and bikes are transported to most locations by trailer. We provide the cross bike. Helmets are required and available at the park for \$5.00 per week. You may bring your own helmet.
- Canoeing / Kayaking: (8 10 & 10+) Develop basic skills and safety techniques learn self and team rescues, trip planning and powering techniques. 3 hour programs explore the Back River, Whitmans Pond, Pond Meadow, Quincy Bay and Hingham Harbor. Longer touring kayaking programs may branch out to Cohasset Harbor or Scituate. Canoeing participants will learn the basic strokes J, sweep and back.
- Camping / Kayaking: (8-10 & 10+) Two camp-outs, one night July 28th limited enrollment! All the basics: tents, fires, and cooking (2 meals and snacks included) with a relaxed paddle to and back from Grape Island. Participants meet at Great Esker Park at 6:00 p.m. and need to be picked up at 8:45 a.m. the next day. If the camp-out gets rained out it will be made up on the Wednesday night of the same week, 7/29.
- Croc Hunter: (10+) Break out the field guides and the toys (nets, boats, binoculars, GPS...) the old shoes and let's go find it. A fun way to "inventory" what's out there! The ultimate live scavenger hunt. May explore marine or fresh water environments.
- Esker Walk-about: (8-10 & 10+) Participants will learn "Esker" skills using GPS (global positioning systems), maps and compasses, fire building, archery and much more and then test themselves individually and as teams in fun-filled competitions in and sometimes out of the park.
- Fishing: (8+) Plenty of fresh water fishing. All equipment and bait is provided or you can bring your own. Participants should wear their "age appropriate" shirt
- Rock Climbing (8-10 & 10+) Participants learn basic climbing and belaying skills using the safest "top-rope" method. All climbing will be done at the Quincy Quarries or Blue Hills Reservation (8-10 & 10+). Participants will be divided by age / ability. Please note: there are two single gender rock climbing programs.
- Tube Rafting (8-10 & 10+) Back on the Back River. Old tire tubes, friends, fun, games, float and soak! Tire tubes are also available at Wessagusset Beach as part of the Wey-Fun Program.

Lifeguard Hours and Responsibilities

The lifeguards assigned to Lane Beach will be on duty June 29th through August 21st, except July 3rd. During these dates the beach will be guarded week-days from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. and on week-ends from 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. A lifeguard attendant will keep the bathrooms open until 6:00 p.m. on week-days. The guards are there to <u>assist</u> beach visitors and respond to emergencies. Please help avoid emergencies by keeping your eye on your children and reporting anything that seems out of place to the lifeguards.

Swimming Lessons Class Descriptions

Pre-school: Ages 3-5yrs. Ratios 5:1

These lessons are designed for young children to become comfortable

in the water and learn basic skills through games, songs, and fun activities.

Level 1: Water Exploration. Ratios 6:1

Starting at age five, this level is designed to help students become acquainted

with the water through games and activities while learning some basic skills in the water.

Level 2: Primary Skills. Ratios 6:1

Games and activities are integrated with more emphasis on basic swimming motions and beginning strokes.

Level 3: Stroke Readiness. Ratios 6:1

Students at this level posses some basic swimming skills and are then

introduced to strokes like front and back crawl, elementary backstroke.

Level 4: Stroke Development. Ratios 7:1

The objective of this level is to aid students in building confidence in their basic swimming

strokes as well as introducing them to more difficult strokes like breast stroke and butterfly.

Level 5: Stroke Refinement. Ratios 7:1

At this level students are refining their strokes through laps, drills and intensive instruction.

Level 6: Competition Skill Proficiency. Ratios 7:1

Our trained staff can provide the skills and instruction needed to succeed in the sport of competitive swimming.

Guard Start

This program is designed for youths 11-15 years old, interested in learning lifesaving skills that can be used in the community as well as in future lifeguard programs or positions. This is not a lifeguard course, although much of the material is similar to an actual lifeguard course. This program is recommended for students that have completed Level 5/6. August 10 - 21 and runs from 11:15 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.





Lane Beach Sailing

All the fundamentals you need to sail a boat. Basic seamanship and a lot of fun. This program will utilize our Catalina 14.2 sailboats. Participants will learn the knots, parts of the boat and sailing theory from chalkboard to the waters of the Fore River and Quincy and Hingham Bays. Plenty of hands on sailing. Ratios: 3:1 See schedule for adult sailing lessons! For adult sailing lessons see page 35.

Lane Beach Kayaking



Summer Safety Tips from the Weymouth Health Dept.

Sun: Minimize Sun Exposure: During the summer season, avoid relying on just sunscreen to protect your child from excess sun exposure. Remember, 80% of our lifetime exposure to the sun occurs during the childhood years.

- You should start with a good sunscreen and then:
- ✓ Avoid mid-day sun when the sun's rays are the strongest (10:00 a.m. -4:00 p.m.).
- \checkmark Cover up with lightweight clothing to protect the arms and legs.
- ✓ Wear a wide brimmed hat/ visor and wear UV sunglasses to protect the eyes.
- \checkmark Have lots of bottled water on hand.
- ✓ Some medications make a person more susceptible to sunburn so extra precautions are needed to avoid prolonged sun exposure. A few such medications are Accutane, Retin A, tetracycline, Cipro, thiazides, griseofulvin, sulfa, Lariam. Check with your doctor or pharmacist if you are not sure as there are many more that can cause sensitivity when combined with sun exposure.

Lyme Disease: From ticks - causes rash, fatigue, fever and flu like symptoms

✓ Wear light colored clothing, use insect repellant with DEET, avoid grassy areas, perform daily tick checks on yourself and your children and promptly remove any ticks. If you think you have been bitten – call your doctor.

- All the prices listed in this book are the "Discount Price". The discount price will go up 10% 2 weeks prior to the start of the program. Register early and save money!!!



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



Town of Weymouth Department of Public Works - Recycling Guidelines

Paper & cardboard:

If it rips, recycle it! Just keep paper free from food and plastic wrapping. Place in paper bags, no plastic bags.

- What to recycle:
 - cardboard (no pizza boxes)
 - paperboard (cereal & tissue boxes, paper towel rolls)
 - magazines & newspapers (glossy paper is okay)
 - phone books & junk mail (no CDs or plastic wrap)
 - milk/juice cartons
 - soft cover books
 - all office paper (no blueprints)

How to prepare paper waste:

- place paper waste together in a paper bag or tie in bundles
- put shredded paper in a stapled & labeled paper bag

Cardboard: it's not that hard!

You have a few options:

- 1. flatten, cut to 3 ft x 3 ft and secure under or between bins;
- 2. flatten, fold & stuff in a paper bag or separate recycling bin
- No need to remove staples, paper clips, spirals, plastic windows on envelopes, or even the plastic spout on milk/juice cartons!

Glass, metal & plastic containers:

Place rinsed containers loose in your bin, no plastic bags. What to recycle:

- aluminum (pie plates, trays & foil), metal cans (tin, steel & aluminum)
- glass containers (any color)
- stiff plastic containers (#1-7, no plastic bags or styrofoam)
- plastic plant pots (#1-7, must be clean)

How to prepare containers:

- rinse & remove lids & caps, when possible wipe out oily containers
- place containers, lids and caps loose in bin
- do not empty grease into drains

Place loose in bin, not in plastic or paper bags.

Leaf & yard waste:

Yard waste in plastic bags is not accepted and will be rejected.

- What to recycle:
 - leaves, grass & plants
 - shrubs, pruning & twigs (thinner than your thumb, shorter than your arm)
 - do not include: tree stumps, rocks, soil, dirt, sand, food or trash

How to prepare yard waste:

- yard waste is not accepted in plastic bags and will not be picked up
- place loose in barrels clearly marked yard waste, or
- place in biodegradable paper yard waste bags that are not stapled or taped
- **bundle & tie** thick tree branches 3 ft x 3 ft

Missed recycling or yard waste? Broken bin? Need another bin? Call 781-337-5100

NOT accepted for curbside recycling:

- no foam packaging
- no packing peanuts
- no broken glass or light bulbs
- no window glass
- no clothes hangers
- no dishes or glasses
- no clothing

no paper take-out containers

- Mixed bins will <u>not</u> be accepted:
 - no plastic bags, trash or styrofoam
 - keep papers separate in a paper bag
 - place rinsed containers with lids removed, loose in your bin

Important tips:

- Set recycling out by 7am on your collection day.
- Do not place papers, containers or yard waste in plastic bags.
- During holiday weeks, collection is delayed 1 day.
- Close the loop! Buy products made from post-consumer recycled materials.




